

Invitation to the On-line Memorial for Michael I. Mishchenko

We bring your attention to the on-line memorial to remember Dr. Michael I. Mishchenko, which will take place on November, 6 (Friday) at 11:00 New York time (16:00 UTC). Please join and help us to make it a memorable event.

The memorial will take place via the Zoom platform (instructions below) with live streaming on YouTube. The corresponding links for both platforms will be sent by e-mail to the participants one day before the event (and repeated one hour before the start). All participants must register through the form – <https://forms.yandex.com/u/5f64914d01c7680384359aac/> (the links will be sent only to those who register). Afterwards, the recording of the event will be made publicly available.

The memorial will last 2-3 hours. It will start with short speeches of family members and friends (the list will be announced later) followed by a free-microphone part, where any participant may contribute. If you wish to do the latter, please indicate it on the registration form. In case you cannot participate live, you may contribute a short recorded video (2-3 minutes) to be shared on the YouTube channel after the event. Please send it to Maxim Yurkin (yurkin@gmail.com).

If you have photos of Michael, please send them to Ludmilla Kolokolova (lkolokol@umd.edu) together with short descriptions (captions). We will make them publicly available as a slide show or on-line gallery after the event. If you wish to show a couple of photos during your speech, you can do it through the “share screen” function of Zoom.

Technical instructions on using Zoom.

If you used Zoom before, then no technical issues should arise. If not, we recommend to spend some time studying it before the meeting. Joining the meeting is described at <https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/articles/201362193-Joining-a-meeting> . You can either install the application on any device (recommended) or connect directly through the browser (this should be possible even if Zoom is banned in your organization). Please specify your real name, so it will be visible during the event (especially if you want to provide voice or chat input).

Participants’ microphones will be muted by default and can be unmuted only by organizers. You may request the latter during the free-microphone part by raising your hand (a special button below the list of participants). We recommend that you turn on your camera in Zoom, at least when you are giving a speech. Zoom allows you to replace the background behind you by arbitrary image, if you wish.

You can use chat in Zoom throughout the whole event – it is possible to send messages to all or to specific participants. If you prefer to watch the event through YouTube, you will not be able to provide input except for the chat at YouTube, but the latter is not synchronized with the Zoom chat. Finally, you can also use Zoom beforehand to record a video if you cannot participate live – see <https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/articles/201362473-Local-recording> (start a conference with yourself as a single participant).

If you have any technical questions about using Zoom or recording video, please contact Matthew Berg (mberg81@gmail.com) or Maxim Yurkin (yurkin@gmail.com). Do the same if you haven’t received a Zoom link by 12 hours before the event.

Since no single event is sufficient to describe Michael's legacy in different communities, we plan a series of various means to achieve this goal. While the online memorial will focus on personal aspects and interactions with other people, his profound scientific contributions will be discussed at the ELS and APOLLO conferences next year.
