The beginning of West-East scientific communications in HMT (late fifties of the last century)

- Two emerging technologies (space exploration and nuclear energy) frantically pursued both in the West and in the Soviet Union prompted both sides to search for scientific communication;
- Both technologies depended heavily on the understanding and managing heat and mass transfer
- A seminal event: meeting of Robert Maxwell (Pergamon Press) with Carl Gazley (Rand Corp.) and Jim Hartnett visiting Soviet Union in 1958
 foundation of a new journal exclusively in heat and mass transfer
- The new journal, IJHMT was born in 1960, with the Editorial Board including E. Brun, A.J. Ede, E. Eckert, U. Grigull, J. Hartnett, A. V. Luikov, W. Rohsenow, D.B. Spalding, N. Zuber,....






